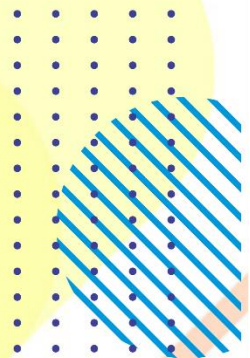

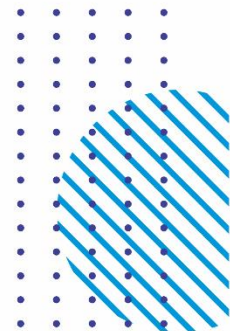

MINUTES OF THE OYO STATE GOVERNMENT STAKEHOLDERS' CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON YEAR 2021 BUDGET FOR IBADAN ZONE 1 HELD AT OGUNLANA HALL, INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE CENTRE, UNIVERSITY OF IBADAN ON THURSDAY 17TH SEPTEMBER 2020
INTRODUCTION

This year's stakeholders' consultative meeting in preparation for the 2021 budget for Ibadan Zone 1 was held at Ogunlana Hall, International Conference Centre; University of Ibadan on Thursday 17th September 2020. Ibadan Zone 1, which was made up of Local Government Areas (LGAs) in Ibadan main city. These are Ibadan North, Ibadan North East, Ibadan North West, Ibadan South East and Ibadan South West.

The stakeholders' consultative meeting on year 2021 budget was presided by the State Governor; Engr. Seyi Makinde, other top members of the Executive arm of government, which includes the Deputy Governor of the State, the Secretary to the State government, the Chief of Staff and the Head of Service; Oyo State were also in attendance. The Honourable Commissioner; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning; Barrister Adeniyi Farinto, the Special Adviser to the Governor on Economic Affairs, Senior Special Assistant on Economic Planning and the Permanent Secretary; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning. The attendees from the society and communities in the Local Government Areas (LGAs) include Traditional rulers, Religious leaders, Civil Society Organisations and other Non-governmental organisations in the State. Others that graced the occasion were Market men and women associations, Youth groups and host of others.

In his welcoming address, the State Commissioner for Budget and Economic Planning, Hon. John Adeniyi Farinto said "Open government initiative would have been smoother but the global economic shift occasioned by the COVID-19 pandemic and the attendant reduction in oil price" as affected the achievements made so far. He added that the present administration has set the pace that is worthy of emulation in economic crisis management.

Hon. Farinto commended the good people of Oyo State for their collective efforts to support government to deploy best practices in determining and implementing people-oriented policies, programmes and projects that will yield meaningful impact on the lives of the people in the State. He added the State was opportuned to access the grants from the State Fiscal Transparency Accountability and Sustainability (SFTAS) programme supported by the World Bank.

The Hon. Commissioner equally applauded the Executive Governor of the State for his approval to commence the overarching blue print that will articulate various development aspiration of the government from 2021 – 2041. According to the Hon Commissioner, the plan will focus on Economic Development, Human Capital, Social Protection & Security, Infrastructure Development, Physical Planning and Sustainability Environment. These pillars will adequately enhance the efforts to transform our socio-economic system, reduce poverty, generate employment and provide basic infrastructure and an impetus for the achievement of our development aspirations.

The representative of Civil Society Organisation; Mr 'Jide Bamgbose from Justice, Development and Peace Commission (JDPC) Ibadan delivered a goodwill message at the meeting. In his goodwill message, he commended the State government for consolidating on the gain's of 2019 stakeholders' engagement on budget process as this will help to improving

service delivery. He emphasizes on the need to institutionalize the Stakeholders' Consultative Meeting on the yearly budget process in the State through policy or law to sustain the practice. In addition, there is need for adequate feedback into the system to enable the people and those in power to assess the performance of Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) and other government actors and the governor's agenda.

He also commended the effort of the State government to have Development Plan as this will make the State to be global compliance in the area of budget process which should include the use of Medium-Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) an annual, rolling three year-expenditure planning which sets out the medium-term expenditure priorities and hard budget constraints against which sector plans can be developed and refined and the Medium-Term Sector Strategy (MTSS)..

Others stakeholders at the consultative meeting that presented their goodwill message were the Caretaker Chairman Ibadan South East; who represented the other four LGs and LCDAs, representative of the State Pensioners and the representative of the People Living with Disabilities (PLWD) they all appreciated the Executive Governor for the good way and manner he is handling the affairs of the State.

The representative of Development Agenda for Western Nigeria (DAWN) Commission in person of Abiodun Oladipo applauded the State Government under the headship of His Excellency, Engr. 'Seyi Makinde on the good initiative to ensuring participatory budget process in the State. This will reflect true democracy where peoples' need will be considered and mainstream into the budget of the State. He equally commended the action of the State government to ensuring that the State continues to improve in the process of preparing budget for the State. He noted that the sustainability of the process is highly essential to assess government performance and to ensuring growth and development of the State. He promised that the DAWN Commission will continue to give the State government technical backstopping to moving the State forward.

In his keynote address, His Excellency, Engr. 'Seyi Makinde the State governor emphasizes on how important people are in terms of ensuring strong democracies-government. This is through power which rests with the people through their elected representatives because the leaders listen to and implement the wishes of the people which were the essence of the stakeholders' consultative meeting. His Excellency stated that the first budget of the present administration was tagged, *The People's Budget* because the government came out and engaged in town hall meetings and sought people's input. The governor informed the gathering that, in spite of the decline in revenue as a result of the effect of the Covid-19 pandemic, the government was able to find a way of ensuring that the planned infrastructural projects were carried out. To achieve this, the government introduced the Alternative Project Funding Approach (APFA), where the contractor executes the entire project with their own money before the government repays over several budgeting cycles

His Excellency concluded by appealing to the stakeholders to use the opportunity to come out and let their voices be heard as the government will continue to work to make sure that people's preferences are paramount as "we are here to serve you".

At this stage representatives from the LGs and LCDAs presented their various needs for consideration in 2021 budget.

**IBADAN SOUTH-EAST LOCAL GOVERNMENT
REQUEST FOR BUDGETING**

- Primary Health Centre:
 - adequate budgeting for drugs to the patients at our Primary Healthcare centers.
 - employ more healthcare personnel to solve the present shortage of personnel.
- Primary School Quest:
- there is need to provide enough furniture for pupils/students at primary and secondary schools.
- employ more staff (academic and non-academic) for the schools in the State to address the issue of inadequate staff.
- provision of potable water and ensure regular sanitation at various wards.
- repair of pipe Borne water for the communities/wards
- the 5% deduction from the local government allocation to be paid to Royal fathers in the LGAs.
- the need to construct a market at Orita Aperin.
- ensure adequate security for the people and properties in the LGA
- needed to urgently repair the link (road) to the Academy express way along Ibadan South-East side to avoid loss of lifes.

- Recruitment of health personnel to health centres

MARKET WOMEN (IBADAN SE): ZAINAB APAKA

- Reference was made to the market at South East, scout camp. As important the market was, the direction of the market was not encouraging to attract traders and customers. The Contractors and the then government failed to consult the market women and men. Hence, the need for the government should please do the needful by repositioning the entrance of the market.
- She appreciated the Governor for endorsing the position of *Babalola general* for the State but there is need to do same for the *Iyalaja general* too.
- Market women are ready to cooperate with the government as being done in Lagos in the area of revenue generation for the government.

PEOPLE LIVING WITH DISABILITY: OLUSOLA OGUNDOLA

Commended the government on her effort to include PLWD in governance but there is still need to do more. The following needs were put forward:

- ❖ Need to consider more PLWD in politics
- ❖ Need to establish an office: Disability Commission.
- ❖ Need to pass into law disability bill which will accommodate them in governance process.
- ❖ Allocation of funds to the PLWD office

PENSIONERS: MRS OYETUNJI OLUREMI

- ❖ She only appreciated the Governor for the good works he has embarked on.

RESPONSES OF THE GOVERNOR TO THE PRESENTATIONS: In his response after listening attentively to the presentations of the representatives from LG and LCDAs, the Executive Governor of the State, Engr. ‘Seyi Abiodun Makinde stated that the instability in the administration of the LGs and LCDAs accounted for in ability to conduct stakeholder meeting for their budget but now that this has been resolved, there will be an improvement in the exercise. In the area of financing capital projects, the Governor took time to give comprehensive information on what the State government had been doing by adopted three funding approaches.

- ✓ Alternative funding approach - i.e the contractor work on while government pays later.
- ✓ Contractor funding approach - i.e the contractor will sort for and use their money for the execution of the project - this approach is been use for the light up Oyo State project and
- ✓ Target borrowing infrastructure loan - this was adopted in the remodeling of OYSADA. He reiterated the commitment of his administration to operation zero pothole in the state and pledge his support for the upgrading of Ibadan Airport for which he has provided needed fund to procure the necessary equipment that may be required for the upgrading.

Finally, he confirmed that 351 wards in the State each of which would have a functional primary health care centre as the renovation has commenced. In the same vein he said a sum of ₦1.08Billion Naira had being released to pay the leave bonus to teachers in the State among other answers he provided to the emerging questions.

He promised to institutionalize the participatory budget process before the exit of his administration. The Executive Governor of the State, Engr. ‘Seyi Abiodun Makinde, also stated that his government is ready for criticism from the people to move the State forward. He assured the people that the entire requests would be considered and would be worked upon by the government.

The gathering was finally closed around 1:42pm with recitation of the second stanza of our National Anthem.







MINUTES OF THE OYO STATE GOVERNMENT STAKEHOLDERS' CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON YEAR 2021 BUDGET FOR OKE OGUN ZONE II HELD AT IGBOHO TOWN HALL, IGBOHO, IBADAN ON WEDNESDAY 23TH SEPTEMBER 2020

Preamble

The meeting started at exactly 11:10am with national anthem of Nigeria followed by the Oyo State anthem. The second stanza of Nigeria national anthem was recited as opening prayer.

Introduction

This year's stakeholders' consultative meeting in preparation for the 2021 budget for Oke-Ogun Zone 1 was held at Igboho Town Hall, Igboho, Oyo state on Wednesday 23rd September 2020. Okeho Zone 1, which was made up of Local Government Areas (LGAs). These local governments include Orelupe, Saki West, Saki East, Irepo, Olorunsogo and ATISBO.

The stakeholders' consultative meeting on year 2021 budget was presided over by the deputy Governor, representing the executive governor of Oyo state, Other members of the Executive arm of government. which includes the Honourable Commissioner; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning; Barrister Adeniyi Farinto, Commissioner for Trade Investment and Cooperative, The Honourable Commissioner; Ministry of Agriculture; the Special Adviser to the Governor on Economic Affairs, Senior Special Assistant on Economic Planning and the Permanent Secretary; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning were in attendance. The attendees from the society and communities in the Local Government Areas (LGAs), Traditional rulers, Religious leaders, Civil Society Organizations (CSO) and other Non-governmental organizations in the State, Market men and women association, Youth groups and host of others graced the occasion.

Welcome Speech

Honourable commissioner; Bar Farinto of the Budget and Economic Planning

The Honourable commissioner; Barr. Farinto of the Budget and Economic Planning stated that OYSADA has been returned to Oke - Ogun as requested during the last stakeholders' engagement. And that contract for the reconstruction of Ogboro – Igboho road has been awarded to show to the people that government is interested in the development of communities and to fulfil all the promises made during previous stakeholders' engagement on budget.

He said there are two major reasons for carrying out the stakeholders' engagement which are;

1. To ask the people whether the people in government have done what they said they will do
2. To ask for what the people want as items that will go into the budget

He appreciated the presence of community leaders, royal fathers, People Living with Disabilities PWD, Market Men and Women, representative of local government, representatives of Christian and Muslim communities and the representative of traditional religion

GOODWILL MESSAGE

Commissioner for Agriculture

He started his speech by informing the gathering that all the projects that have been carried out are projects that were requested by the people in the Oke-Ogun area, he said others that have not been carried out would be attended to very soon..

Dr. Babatunde Musibau - SA to Governor on Economic Matters

Special Adviser to Governor on Economic Matters; solicited for people support for government on the ongoing progress being made in the society despite the coronavirus pandemic.

Orelope Federal Constituency - Olumide Ojerinde aka Omoolore

The representative of Orelope Federal Constituency was of the opinion that the most important thing is infrastructure, Road, hospital, water and electricity. He said development should be equally distributed in Oyo state without prejudice.

Local Government Areas Representative (Hon. Santana)

He started by saying that he has never seen anything like having an opposition member attending a programme organized by a sitting government on stakeholders' engagement

He said things have turned from "top to bottom" to "bottom to top". He also said the music of the moment has turned to "never seen before".

He cleared the air on the number of projects that had been brought to Oke-Ogun area by saying that the amount spent on the ongoing road construction projects at Oke-Ogun and its environment is huge compared to any other project in other zones in Oyo state including Ibadan.

Security had become a thing of challenge especially places like Irepo/Orelope/Olorunsogo, Oniyeye, Igboho forest etc he then requested that security and logistic support should be made available for the people of the area. He also mentioned their successes on the issue of security which he believed that if government can render adequate support, security of the area can be improved.

Alepata of Igboho Land:

He appreciates all attendees of the stakeholders' engagement program as well as all the dignitaries that graced the occasion

Keynote Speech by Deputy Governor

His excellency the Deputy Governor of Oyo state started his keynote address by saying that he is also a son of the soil and therefore he has made efforts in providing solution to some of the challenges in his own capacity. He however mentioned that he has made provision for motorcycles for security agents so that they can use these motorbikes to reach place where patrol vans cannot reach and for the ease of movement. He admonished the people that security is not the duty of the government alone but a collective responsibility of both the Citizens and the government.

REQUEST

Irepo Local Government

The representative spoke about The Open University established at Kishi area of Oke-Ogun. He advised the government to work on putting the Open University in Oke-Ogun back in place as it is the 2nd institution in Oyo state.

Ago-Are, Tede, Irawo, Sabe, Baasi, Ofiki and Owo communities (ATISBO).

- requested for patrol van and motorbike for security
- more people should be recruited into Amotekun from Oke-Ogun because of its proximity to the Benin Republic and by doing so, the people who know the terrain can handle the insecurity situation in Oke-Ogun area.

Introduction

The meeting started at 10:11 am with national anthem of Nigeria followed by the Oyo State anthem and the second stanza of Nigeria national anthem was recited as opening prayer.

The royal father said Ogbomoso requested for the stakeholders' engagement event to be brought to Ogbomoso and this request was granted by his Excellency in the preparation for 2021 fiscal budget year.

He also appreciated the governor on the revival of Oko fruit processing company by handing it over to investors who will bring the activities back to this abandoned company. He said anytime the government plans to do anything in Ogbomoso royal fathers should be carried along.

On education: The Ohunpetu of Ijero showered encomium on the governor of Oyo state for the initiative taken during COVID19 pandemic, by opening the schools before any other state and the country at large, for relaxing lockdown, distribution of free textbooks and exercise books for children in schools in public school

His royal highness said the CBT test for teachers is skewed against the people of the rural community because they don't have access to computer knowledge and request that the cut-off mark is reduced considering the lack of access and knowledge of computer in the rural communities like Ogbomoso and its environ.

He said when next the event will be taking place; people should be allowed in enough time to put their thoughts together at least 48 hours before the commencement of the stakeholders' engagement. He advised that the government should invest in Modern agriculture, where small amount of land that is used by referring to greenhouse farming. Grass plantation for feeding of cows and other animals as a good example of sustainable agriculture which will also curb the problem of herds destroying farms. He recommended that the state government should look for the professor working on sustainable agriculture who is also a citizen of Oyo State.

He also advised that government can also concentrate on aquaculture by specializing on a particular species of crop which will give Oyo state a comparative advantage. He said farm

settlements in Ogbomosho does not have the presence of government, therefore nothing good is coming out of these farms except for what they will eat. He spoke on Industrial Estate in Ogbomosho which was established in 1993 which has not produced anything, he said the government should focus more on igniting the passion of industrialist in producing locally made goods.

He said it is important that Oyo state government explore World Bank project grants on issue of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene as well as flood prevention projects in Oyo state. The royal father said erosion is becoming a big problem and that he has developed a booklet that highlighted some of the places where erosion has greatly affected in Ogbomosho Township.

He also said the government should explore working with Federal Government irrespective of whether they are in the same party or not to help Oyo state get more projects to further the development of the State.

Orile Gbon

The royal father said, capital expenditure and capital projects should be raised to help people enjoy good governance in Oyo state as this is the only thing that can tough the generality of the people. He advised the government to explore uses of cashew in the LAUTECH to generate fund both for the institution and the government. He pressed further by saying that, if this cashew can be explored it can give institutions the power to finance itself.

He said the government should establish GRAs in the Gambari area where there is abundance of land. He said housing schemes in Orire, Surulere, Ogo-Oluwa etc will bring drastic development to Ogbomosho town. He explained that Orire and Surulere are the biggest in terms of the landmass in Oyo State, therefore the government should see this as an opportunity to come up with housing scheme initiatives which will also push back the bandits and terrorist hiding thick forest.

Representative of Soun of Ogbomosho

In his Goodwill message, he advice the organizer of the event that they should afford to send information on time to the people for them to prepare for a great occasion like this.

Keynote address by the Executive Governor was presented by the honorable commissioner for Education, barr Olaleye

REQUEST

- Prices of shops in front of LAUTECH should be reduced for affordability sake.
- Ogbomosho North hospital should be well equipped and fenced
- he said Oyo state should not accept sharing of LAUTECH responsibility with Osun state and that the value of 30 years of Ogbomosho land should be put into the asset sharing negotiation to put the state at the vantage position.
- The teachers that will be employed for Ogbomosho should come from Ogbomosho.
- Idi-Ege road to Iseyin should be repaired.
- The 100 KVA power plant should be fixed.
- Water Works: all the equipment at the water work station has been taking to Ibadan, he, therefore, advised the government to stop people doing these as it may result into pandemonium because the Ogbomosho people might start resisting people doing this

Ogbomoso South

He submitted the request in a written document but emphasized that bad road is one of the biggest problems confronting the people of the area, therefore, the government should do well to help them in fixing the roads.

Ogo Oluwa

Ogbomoso to Ogooluwa has become a big problem for the people of Ogooluwa who plies the road regularly. Iwo-Are to Agbedu has also become a death trap for the motorist and farmers that may want to sell their farm produce in Ibadan.

He also raised the concern about the noon schooling for children and the difficulty it might pose to children's ability to learn in the sun also considering the schedule of their parents.

Orire Local Government - Ismail Adetunji

The representative of Oriire local government listed the following:

- Education
- higher institution
- Technical school
- road

Surulere Local Government - Ibitoye Olusola

Boundary adjustment: he called the attention of Oyo state government to the issue of Osun state overstepping its boundaries and advised that government should do what is needed to prevent intrusion of Osun State into Oyo state territories. He suggested that if the state can construct Iwofin road (Ajegunle, Lakun etc), this will prevent Osun State from intruding into Oyo state territories.

One other salient point he placed before the government is the incessant attack on farmlands in the area and he suggested that if the government can hasten the process of establishing the security outfit codenamed Amotekun and employ the local people it makes the process more effective as they know the terrain better.

Muslim Community representative Alh Adesoji

- As a religious leader, he advocated for the Employment of teachers taking religious studies in schools to promote morals and the acceptable value of our society.
- He advocated that facilities should be provided for schools in Ogbomoso.
- Health care system should be placed on the priority list of the government.
- Oyo State government should provide support for people to get prepaid meters which will solve the problem of crazy billing and will force the IBDEC to give people power supply.

Christian Community Pastor Joseph Adegoke

- Mention the issue of potholes in Ogbomoso major roads and called on government to put the Ogbomoso people in the "Operation no pothole project".
- He said there is need for portable water and boreholes because people in the interiors of Ogbomoso are suffering from lack of potable water.
- Allocation to religious body should be returned.

- Equal distribution of benefits to religious bodies should be promoted such as pilgrimages, employment opportunity etc
- The issue of payment for signboard by the religious organization should be addressed.
- Sale of land to foreigners by Royal fathers should be discouraged as this can contribute to insecurity in any community.

Market women Chief Mrs. Bose Oyetunde - Iyaloja

- Oja-osan was established but has been neglected
- Provision of toilet in the markets in Ogbomoso

Artisans - absent

Youth Mr Benjamin

- Youth in Ogbomoso and its environs should be properly empowered.
- Jalubosa road, maternity Junction, Laberu road are all begging for repairs
- Laberu was abandoned by GSM government
- Cut-off mark for teaching employment should be reduced

People living with disabilities PWD

- Schools for people living with disability should be established in various communities in Oyo state to ease their access to educational opportunity and facilities.

Royal Fathers

- Boundary adjustment
- 5% for royal fathers
- Oyo state should take care of boundary communities to prevent the intruders from intruding into Oyo state territory

Deacon Samson Oyebode (King – Royal Father)

- He advocated that Kings in Ogbomoso should be taken care of
- He also advocated that apart from 5% allocation to the Royal fathers he advised the government to make provision for more funding to help the Royal fathers taken care of certain needs in their domains without having to consult government. He said people preferred to go to their royal fathers before thinking about government

Oba Samuel - Olopete of Opete

- He mentioned unemployment
- Mechanized farming should be promoted
- government to subsidize greenhouse farming

RESPONSES

Commissioner for Trade, Investment and cooperative's response

The honorable commissioner response was based on some of the salient points as touching his ministry. He said the issue of market is within the jurisdiction of local governments. He said abattoir is about to be completed in the market. He assured the people that the untouched expanse of land behind the market will soon be developed to bring life to that community which will, in turn, promote marketing activities in that area. He said the industrial estate has not been costed yet and therefore no one is allowed to chase anyone away from that place and money collected by any unsuspecting individual is not an order from the government.

Commissioner for Budget and Economic Planning

The hournable commissioner started by apologizing and promised that in planning the next stakeholders' engagement on budget preparation, proper notice will be sent before the event; at least 48 hours before the event. he said Coronavirus has negatively impacted on the preparation for this event. However, one more week will be allowed for the submission of the people's opinion and request which will be included in the 2021 budget.

Governor's Response

The Hournorable Commissioner for Education responded on behalf of the executive governor of Oyo state, His Excellency Engr Seyi Makinde.

He said LAUTECH resources would be explored as advised once the negotiation for the ownership was concretized. He further reinstates the effort of Oyo state government towards ensuring that LAUTECH becomes the property of Oyo state in full. In his response to ease of doing business he said one of the major focuses of Oyo state government is to create an enabling environment for businesses to thrive. As it concerned the issue of teachers' employment, despite 50% cut-off mark as proposed for the Employment, the process has gotten more than needed and he assured that enough teachers will be recruited for each zone. he said 7000 scored more than 50% while 30,000 scored an average of 40% and the activities wishes to employ 2000nteachers.

He addressed the issue of adjusted time for schools by saying; only one hour was added to school time. he said instead of schools to close by 2pm only one hour was added which means the student will now be closing by 3pm and that the children have been broken into two which is morning session will run from 8am to 11am and the afternoon session will run from 12noon to 3pm. Also, teachers teaching religious study are part of teachers that will be included in the recruitment exercise.



**MINUTES OF THE OYO STATE GOVERNMENT STAKEHOLDERS'
CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON YEAR 2021 BUDGET HELD AT IGBOORA ON
MONDAY 28TH SEPTEMBER 2020**

INTRODUCTION

For the first time in Oyo State, Oyo State government held a Stakeholders' consultative meeting with the people of Igboora. This was geared towards reflecting and making their input into the 2021 budget of Oyo State. The engagement was facilitated by Oyo State Ministry of Budget and Economic planning where we had in attendance, the Speaker of the Oyo State House of Assembly; Rt. Hon. Adebo Ogundoyin an indigene from the zone; who represented the Executive Governor of the State, Engr. Seyi Abiodun Makinde. Together with the Speaker were the Clerk of the House; Ms Foluke Oyediran and Hon. Peter Ojedokun; representing Ibarapa Central/North. The Executive members present were the Hon. Commissioner for budget and Economic Planning for the State; Barrister Adeniyi Farinto, the Hon. Commissioner for Youth and Sport; Hon. Seun Fakorede. Others are Dr. M. Adetunji Babatunde; Special Adviser to the Governor on Economic Affairs, Mr. Oluwaseyi Ogunsanya; Senior Special Assistant on Economic Planning, Mrs. M. O. Adebisi; the Permanent Secretary; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning. The Chairman, Water Cooperation of Oyo State Dr. Adepoju was not left out.

Some of the people also present at the meeting were the Directors from the Local Governments (LGs), traditional rulers from Ibarapa North, Ibarapa East and Ibarapa Central, the Iya loja of Ibarapaland; Mrs. Tina Ogundoyin, religious leaders (Christians and Muslims), representative of the Community Development Council (CDC), the youth, People Living With Disability (PLWD), Artisans and community members.

The meeting commenced with the National Anthem and that of the State at exactly 12:15pm while the opening prayer was said by reciting the second stanza of the National Anthem. The welcome remark was made by the Honourable Commissioner for Budget and Economic Planning. The Commissioner recognises the distinguished members including the Speaker whom he described as wearing to caps: as the representative of the Governor and himself; as a son from the zone. He equally recognised other sons from the region including Mr Seun Fakorede and Hon. Peter Ojedokun. He also acknowledged the presence of Directors of different sectors, the traditional rulers present among others.

In his remark, the commissioner emphasised on the promise of the Executive Governor to consult the people in the State before the preparation of the State fiscal budget, during the implementation and after to assess the performance of the MDAs and the Government as a whole. Hon. Farinto flashed back the memories of the audience on the same exercise the previous year where the consultative meetings were held in the three senatorial districts: Oyo North, Oyo Central and in Oyo South where the needs of the people which were presented by

the people were equally mainstreamed into the ongoing 2020 budget of the State; hence the need to do same for 2021 budget. The Commissioner recalled the pressure from the Speaker and other stakeholder on what his Ibarapa people stands to benefit in the long-run.

According to him, the stakeholders' meeting has become a yearly activity in the course of preparing the State budget. This year's exercise was held in the seven (7) geo-political zones in the State which includes this ongoing consultative meeting that is the three Ibarapas. In addition, the remaining two zones; Oyo and Iseyin would round off the remaining zones for all the seven zones scheduled for the meeting. The commissioner enjoined the people present at the programme to seize the opportunity to present their needs as it will benefit the entire people in the region as against personalising the needs.

Hon. Peter Ojedokun in his goodwill message regarded the day as a unique; a day to present their need into the proposed 2021 State budget. The Hon. called the attention of the stakeholders to also look into the means of generating income which is always left for the government as against been a collective responsibility.

The Commissioner for Youth and Sport; Hon. Seun Fakorede in his Goodwill message, appreciated the present government headed by His Excellency, Engr. 'Seyi Makinde for the opportunity to consult the people as against the previous governments. He stated that despite the COVID-19 pandemic, the present government deemed it fit to do the needful; hence the people should use the ample opportunity judiciously. The view of the Chairman, Water Cooperation of Oyo State, was not quite similar to that of the Commissioner for Youth and Sport. The Chairman added that the purpose of the presentation should be for the benefit of the people and most especially to the development of the seven Ibarapa (*Ibarapa me jeje*).

The representative of all the Chairmen of all Local Governments (LGs) from the zone, represented by Hon. Gbenga Obalowo representing Ibarapa East appreciated the Executive Governor of the State, for not imposing projects and programmes on the people in the State. Despite the existence of the COVID-19, the Governor still consider consulting the people for their input into the 2021 budget, hence the people should do the needful based on the opportunity that comes their way.

The Onilanla of Lanlate, on behalf of other traditional rulers in his expected goodwill message went straight to present the needs of traditional rulers in the area. The traditional ruler started by requesting for an upward review of the 5% allocation given traditional rulers in the State. According to him, the allocation is too small. Other sector of concern was on the issue of health with focus of the inability of our Primary Healthcare centres to meet the needs of the people. According to him, no enough medical staff, no drugs and the environment of most centres are in bad situation. Also, the Palaces of traditional rulers need to be improved to the expected standard of others rulers in the State. The benefit of "*Light up Oyo State*" which is being enjoyed by the capital of the State; Ibadan, should spread to the benefit of the people in Ibarapa.

In the keynote address by the Speaker of the Oyo State House of Assembly; Rt. Hon. Adebo Ogundoyin on behalf of His Excellency, Engr. 'Seyi Makinde the State governor emphasizes on how important people are in terms of ensuring strong democracies-government. The Speaker thereafter presented the Speech on behalf of the Governor.

At this juncture, representative different stakeholders from the council areas (LGs and LCDAs) were given the opportunity to present their needs for the 2021 budget. Barrister

Adeniyi Farinto; the Commissioner for Budget and Economic Planning realized that it appears the people were not fully prepared to present their needs as they were reluctant to come out for their presentation. He however gave his assurance that in case there are gaps or inability to harmonize their needs, the government will give them one week to submit their need to the Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning. According to him, the address in which they are to forward their needs will be made available before the end of the programme.

IBARAPA CENTRAL:

- There are poor sporting facilities. Hence, the need to complete the stadium at Igboora for the benefit of the youth.
- For Community Development Councils (CDCs), there is need to move the CDCs from the Ministry of Women Affairs to the Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs.

IBARAPA NORTH: Sir. Olawuwo the Senate Chairman of PDP and the Leader of the Party in the Zone

- There is need repair the Oke-Ogun road: Igangan, Okeho etc
- The abandoned State hospital in Igangan needs immediate completion for the benefit of the people.
- There is no electricity in the zone. There is need to address this.
- The abandoned dam project in Ayiete should be completed. So that the problem of non availability of potable water could be solved.
- This is also applicable to Okugba Dam and other dams.

IBARAPA EAST: Chief J. A. Pejuola

- The road from Ibadan which stopped at Kara need completion. Those that need repair must also be fixed.
- The entire State road in the Council areas must be repair.
- All necessary sporting facilities including the Stadium are to be refurbished for the benefit of the people.
- In the Agriculture, all the road leading to the farms need to be fixed for easy movement of agricultural produce.
- On the issue of security, all the people in Ibarapa and even the entire State need and improved security system. This should be through the provision of additional security officers / personnel such as vigilante. There should also be provision for motorcycle to complement the effort put into their work.

CHRISTIAN REPRESENTATIVE: Pastor Ishola Olayanju

- Need to repair the State own roads and facilitate how the Federal roads could be repaired too.
- All the road leading to farm settlements are bad. Hence, the need to fix these roads.
- Farmers in the zone need tractors and fertilizer at subsidized rate.
- Education: the current situation of both primary and secondary schools is bad. No enough furniture, insufficient teachers and non availability of non-teaching staff such as security men (Day and Night).

MULISM REPRESENTATIVE:

- The issues raised was similar to the Christians but added that

- Scholarship / sponsoring opportunity for Muslims to the Holy land should be encouraged by the State government.

IYA LOJA OF IBARAPA LAND: Mrs. Tina Ogundoyin

- Need to address the problem of poor sanitation in all the markets: No refuse disposal points, No toilet etc. Although she claimed to have commenced the building of one toilet in Maya market.
- Non availability of loan to market men and women to do their business is a major problem. Even when loans are available through the nongovernmental agencies such as the micro finance; the interest rates are always outrageous which makes it difficult to pay back.

YOUTH: Isikiru Mufutau

- The youths need employment from the government.
- There should be loan opportunity for artisans.
- There is need to address the conflict between herdsmen and farmers. This has become a serious problem.
- There is need to assist farmers in terms of loans and storage facilities.

ARTISANS: Kamorudeen Adeyemi

He appreciated the effort of the State government on the provision of palliative during the COVID-19 pandemic to the people of the zone.

- Need for fund to run their business.
- The State government should assist the Lgs so that the Lgs will be able to assist the people at the grassroots.

REPRESENTATIVE OF TRADITIONAL LEADERS:

Chief commented on the statement made by the Commissioner for Budget and Economic Planning on their unpreparedness to present their needs. He stated that they were not well informed about what the programme is all about but appreciated the Commissioner for the opportunity given them to submit a formal written document if need be to his office.

PEOPLE LIVING WITH DISABILITY (PLWD): Talitu Kasali

- Establishment of the physically challenged Commission
- The government should provision wheel chairs
- Consider the welfare PLWD during the development activities in the State. According to her, most of the roads have no provisions to care for the PLWD, same as buildings such as at the various healthcare centres, schools, MDAs etc.
- Monthly stipend for the PLWD

TRADITIONAL RULERS: ONIDERE OF IDNERE

- Need to repair Ayiete road, Awha road close to Idenre
- All community roads
- It is important to look into the revenue side of the budget. According to him, tourism is one of the most important means to achieving this. Hence the Idenre government should look into this direction. Also, are our market places. If the markets are in good condition where there are toilet and regular clearing of refuse, it will serve as income generation to the State and Local governments
- The mentioned Dams are equally inclusive as there could serve as revenue for the government.
- He also irritated on the 5% allocation to the traditional leaders which he regarded as been too small. He added that the percentage was not even from the Gross but from the Net. Even, as the allocation is from the Net, the payment is not even regular.

OLERU OF ILU TAPA

- Those serving as Adoc-hoc staff in the Education sector and the Health sector should be made permanent staff as they have shown their loyalty and dedication while on their job as volunteers in some cases. According to him without political campaign the government stands the opportunity to win because these crops of people will even do the needful for the benefit they most have achieved.

OLU OF IGBOORA

- He irritated the view of others but added that there is need to visit the increasing rate of out of school children which is alarming and has started affecting the development communities and the society as a they grow up.

RESPONSES

Hon. Farinto in his response appreciated the people for the presentations made. He assured them that the efforts of the State government in moving the forward will get to them the more. On the issue of farm settlement, the Commissioner stated that a sum of ₦7.6 Billion had being approved for this. He promised that by the first quarter of 2021 the people will feel the impact of the government than before. In addition, On the issue of the 5% allocation to traditional rulers, the Commissioner for Budget and Economic Planning said the allocation is according to what is in the constitution of the Federal Republic 1999 (as Amendment); hence it goes beyond the State government. However, the traditional leaders could write to His Excellency informing him on the matter and at the same time, the suggestion of empowerment to traditional ruler also be looked into.

In in his own contribution the Commissioner for Sport; Hon. Seun Fakorede, stated that work had commenced six weeks ago at Adamasigba stadium which would cost 5.5 Billion. The Governor is also working towards other stadia such as the one in Eruwa, Oyo, Ogbomoso including the Olubadan stadium where the work would soon commence. According to Hon. Seun Fakorede, the contractors have been mandated to use people within the community where the stadia were established as against importing people from other states of country. On the issue of tourism as a means to generate revenue, he referred to the action of the Commissioner for Information and Tourism led a team of expertise to Idenre a day before. The essence was to look into how the available facility on how it could boost the economy of the State compare to the current situation.

The Chairman, Water Cooperation of Oyo State was not left out. In his response, he acknowledged the people for their know-how on the available dams and the opportunity therein. He promised that more will be done as some parts in Ibarapa East had started enjoying potable water. Subsequently, work had already commenced at Igboora and Idnere but still need more time for completion. The abandoned projects at Ayiete and Igangan will surely commence as from next year.


Hon. Peter Ojecdokun also stated that farming is the occupation of the people in the zone, issue of herdsmen and farmers conflict which as being affecting the farmers. According to the Hon., the issue is being addressed accordingly. The Igangan to Igboora road will be repaired and the issue on insecurity as it affects the area is still being addressed too.

The final response was from the Speaker of the State House of Assembly where he stated that there is need to prioritize the need of the people since the budget according to the listed need would have gone beyond the expected budget for the zone. Based on this, the Rt. Hon. Speaker stated that there will be regular feedback to the people on the 2021 budget by January 2021 after the budget most have been passed. He was surprised that none of the presenters presented issues on any of the available institution in the zone. The Rt. Hon. Speaker promised to ensure that the House continues to empower the institution in the interest of the development. The Speaker promised to look into the issue of CDCs which is under the Ministry of Women Affairs as against Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs. On the issue of security, the Speaker stated that each local government had been mandated to employ 50 people as members of *Amotekun (Newly approved security outfit)*. Interested, willing, able and ready people could apply at their local government for the purpose.

The vote of thanks was said by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning; Mrs. M. O. Adebisi. She appreciated all the participants for the role they played to ensure that the consultative meeting was successful.





MINUTES OF THE OYO STATE GOVERNMENT STAKEHOLDERS' CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON YEAR 2021 BUDGET HELD IN OYO ON MONDAY 28TH SEPTEMBER 2020

INTRODUCTION

This consultative meeting commenced at exactly 11:00am with the National and the State Anthem while the second stanza of the National serves as the opening prayer.

The following people graced the occasion: Chief Oyebisi L. Ilaka who represented the Executive Governor of the State, Engr. Seyi Abiodun Makinde. Others are Hon. Commissioner for budget and Economic Planning for the State; Barrister Adeniyi Farinto, the Hon. Commissioner for Energy; Hon. Seun Asamu. Dr Idowu Oyeleke, Hon. Commissioner for Environment and Natural Resources Dr. M. Adetunji Babatunde; Special Adviser to the Governor on Economic Affairs, Mr. Oluwaseyi Ogunsanya; Senior Special Assistant on Economic Planning, Mrs. M. O. Adebisi; the Permanent Secretary; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning. Others are, the Caretaker Chairman and Directors from the Local Governments (LGs) in the Zone, traditional rulers the representative of the Community Development Council (CDC), religious leaders (Christians and Muslims), the youth, Artisans, People Living With Disability (PLWD) and community members.

The welcome address was presented by Hon. Farinto where he applauded the people of Oyo town right from His Royal Majesty, *Iku Baba Yeye*, Alaafin of Oyo; Oba Lamidi Adeyemi, the Chief of Staff; Chief Oyebisi L. Ilaka, Royal fathers present, Caretaker Chairmen and Directors from the Local Governments (LGs). He started by explaining grey areas encountered in the course of organizing the consultative meeting. According the Hon. Commissioner, the instruction from the Executive Governor of the State; His Excellency Engr. Seyi Makinde was that the participants should not be more than 50 due to the existence of COVID-19.

He later flashed back the memory of the audience on the last 2019 consultative meeting held in the three senatorial districts. According to the Hon. Farinto, the Executive Governor of the state had since then continued to fulfill his promise by consulting the people in the course of preparing the budget and mainstream their needs into the ongoing the proposed budget. He pointed that two actions are expected time to time. The first to track the previous need in the ongoing budget and secondly, to compare what was done and what are yet to be done. For instance is the road from Gedu – Oroki – Asipa which has just being approved the previous week. This shows that the people have started benefiting from the dividend of democracy. He then instructed the people to use the opportunity to present their needs for appropriate action.

The Commissioner for Environment; Hon Lateef Oyeleke appreciated the Commissioner for Budget and Economic Planning on the achievement made so far but equally stated that there is still room to do more. For instance is on the ongoing TESCOM recruitment exercise. He appealed to the people to seize the opportunity to present their needs to the government. In the view of the Commissioner for Energy, he promised the people in Oyo town that the benefit of *operation light up Oyo State* will get to them. On the issue of health, at least 40 Primary Healthcare centres stand the opportunity of being improved to ensuring an effective and quality service delivery to the people.

The State Special Adviser to the Governor on Economic Affairs; Dr. M. Adetunji Babatunde, who was also from Oyo town emphasizes on the benefit of inclusive budget process which the State government as embarked. According to him, the process will cover between 70 - 75% of government budget for year 2021. Although the needs of the people differ but this could be narrow down to some specific sectors. These are health, education, infrastructure such as roads among others. He shared his past experience in a similar consultative meeting where the most pressing need of the people was found to be on having an improved security as against all other indentified needs. He advised the people to present their needs as it will benefit the entire town and it environs than individual needs.

The caretaker chairman, Oyo West on behalf of other caretaker chairmen appreciated the Executive Governor for the achievements recorded so far and the opportunity giving to the people to present their needs. According to him the consultative meeting will surely bring in development to Oyo town. He added that there is need to do more on the issue of herdsmen and farmers conflict which has continue to hinder crop production for the benefit of the industrial sector and consumption.

The keynote address was delivered by the representative of the Executive Governor; Chief Oyebisi L. Ilaka. He commenced his speech by making reference to Oyo Federal Constituency in which the present government as embarked on at least one project in all the four local governments (Atiba, Oyo East, Oyo West and Afijio). In addition, all projects award in Oyo town were given to Oyo contractors and have being mandated to engage the indigenes during the implement of the project. He cognizes the need for more projects but left this to the hands of the presenters; who will make presentations of their needs. The Chief of Staff promised the people to also monitor the projects be it Federal of State because the projects are theirs. This will serve as sustainability measures on the projects for future purpose. At this juncture, the Chief of Staff went ahead to present the Governor's speech.

MINUTES OF THE OYO STATE GOVERNMENT STAKEHOLDERS' CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON THE YEAR 2021 BUDGET FOR ISEYIN HELD AT ISEYIN TOWN HALL, ISEYIN, OYO STATE ON FRIDAY 2ND OCTOBER 2020

Introduction

The meeting started at 10:11 am with the national anthem of Nigeria followed by the Oyo State anthem and the second stanza of Nigeria national anthem was recited as opening prayer. This year's stakeholders' consultative meeting in preparation for the 2021 budget was held at Iseyin, Iwajowa, Kajola and Itesiwaju Local Governments on Friday 2nd October 2020. Oke-Ogun zone 2, which was made up of Local Government Areas (LGAs) and Local Council Development Areas (LCDAs). These local government include Iseyin, Iwajowa, Kajola and Itesiwaju led by Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning.

The stakeholders' consultative meeting on the year 2021 budget was chaired by the Deputy Governor, representing the executive governor of Oyo state. Others were the Honourable Commissioner; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning; Barrister Adeniyi Farinto, Commissioner for Trade Investment and Cooperative, The Honourable Commissioner; Ministry of Agriculture; the Special Adviser to the Governor on Economic Affairs, Senior Special Assistant on Economic Planning and the Permanent Secretary; Ministry of Budget and Economic Planning. The attendees from the society and communities in the Local Government Areas (LGAs) and Local Council Development Areas (LCDAs) include Traditional rulers, Religious leaders, Civil Society Organizations (CSO) and other Non-governmental organizations in Oyo state. Others that graced the occasion are Market men and women association, Youth groups and host of others including political officeholders.

He started his opening speech by reminding the participants that the stakeholders' engagement was carried out in 3 senatorial districts during the previous budget preparation. While this time around the state government has seen the need to ensure the convenience of the people that will participate in the process and thereby, carrying out the stakeholders' engagement in the 7 political zones in Oyo state.

He said there are 2 major reasons why the stakeholder's engagement is very necessary:

1. the program is necessary to allow the people to tell the government what the community needs
2. and to feed the citizen bank on the level of progress the government have made in the past year.

Furthermore, he reminded the people that during the last year stakeholders' engagement, the administration made a promise that what the people need is what the government will do. he,

therefore, posed the question to them whether the government has delayed from what they have asked for or not. he also promised that the participatory budgeting idea will continue and we not experience a seizure at the middle of the road. he also promised that feedback will be available and the channel for people to feed the government-backed also be made possible he said during the last year stakeholder's engagement one of the major problems mentioned at Oke-Ogun area was Moniya-Iseyin which is presently ongoing despite the coronavirus pandemic. he also said saki road was also mentioned turning the last year stakeholder's engagement which has been contracted to another contractor to take up the job due to the sluggishness of the former contractor and that the work will start the following Monday. Saki-Ogboro to Igboho will soon be executed and it is a promise. Wasimi road has been approved and the design is almost done.

he pointed out that the previous administration and other governments in Nigeria are in the Habit of determining what the people want but Engr Seyi Makinde led administration will always allow the people to tell the government what they want. He closed his remark by saying whatever you say shall determine the import into 2021 budget.

Commissioner for Women Affairs

She also used the avenue to appreciate the people of Iseyin for the word warm welcome for the first lady of Oyo state but she emphasized that the people asked for women in conclusion in politics during her excellency's visit.

Commissioner for Agriculture

we appreciate the appreciated the governor of Oyo state and the good people of Iseyin and closed his remark by pleading with the people to go straight to the point while presenting their request to the government.

PDP Chairman (Iseyin)

The Chairman of the People's Democratic Party. He also cited the example of Iganna to Awaye Road as one of the major roads I needed the quick intervention of the government.

Address of the governor as represented by the deputy governor of the state.

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
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
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
